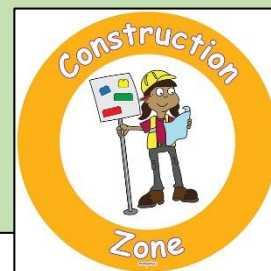
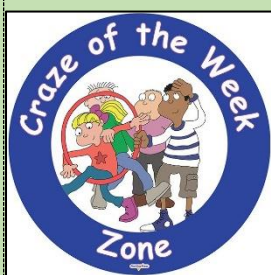
The Young Voice of Halling
