Please note: all referrals must initially go through Ms Shona Eakins or Mrs Debbie Tyler, in Ms Eakins' absence. The Senior Leadership Team and Inclusion Team will have responsibilities regarding children under Social Services or with Child Protection issues.

We have an email account that has been set up specifically for safeguarding emails:

This email account is monitored daily by the DSL, Ms Shona Eakins and the DDSLs, Mrs Debbie Tyler and Ms Lisa Taylor.



School drop-off and pick-up times are always exceptionally busy which is one of the reasons why we have members of staff stationed at the gates. Please do keep a close eye on toddlers who can easily get lost in the sea of parents and carers, as we cannot always guarantee that a member of staff will be on the main car park gate.

On Thursday 29th September at 2:00pm Mrs Tyler is leading a workshop on all things 'Safeguarding' for parents and carers with children in Year 5 and Year 6.

The workshop will cover topics such as online safety, gangs and grooming, peer pressure and the effects of social media on mental health and wellbeing.

Unfortunately, we have already had a number of complaints from residents in the local community who live in the roads closest to our school.

We have also received a number of complaints from parents and carers who are highly concerned about the safety of Halling's children.

The school run is such a busy time and the roads closest to school always become heavily congested.

The complaints have been in respect of parents and carers parking inconsiderately on the kerb, grass verges and/or blocking driveways. This has, in turn, forced pedestrians to walk on the road and there have already been a few near misses.

There was even a car seen reversing off the grass verge and blocking the pathway for our families!

The last thing we want is for anyone to get hurt.

Please be respectful of our neighbours and school community and ensure that we are all working together to keep everyone safe.



#### Our improvement priorities in Halling's 180 Day Plan for Terms 1-3 are as follows:

1. Improving Outcomes

- 2. Introducing and Embedding AAT Core 'Pedagogy' Principles
- 3. Developing and Strengthening Leadership at all Levels, including Governance
  - 4. Early Years: Strengthening Provision and Outcomes
- 5. Strengthening the Curriculum across the School, including Wider Opportunities

Number 2 is all about 'Kagan Structures'. Your child may have come home and talked about: Rally Robin, Round Robin and Think Pair Share! These are just some of the strategies we are now using in our lessons to enable the children to have a more active role in collaboration with their class mates. Research shows that this approach to teaching and learning helps with long term memory retention and, of course, it goes hand in hand with our Chris Quigley curriculum which is also designed around long term memory retention. You could ask your child if they have used the Kagan Mat below - can they explain it to you?



Aspiration

Our pupils will learn the importance of aiming high. It will allow them to recognise and explore all opportunities to them both now and in the future. In order to achieve their goals, our children will need to become resilient, reflective and persevering individuals in all that they do.

Curiosity

Our curriculum will inspire pupils to have the confidence to explore, investigate and immerse themselves in their creativity and learning.

Independence

At Halling, we want our pupils to be lifelong learners; independence is key for them to be able to reach this end goal. We aim to promote independence and perseverance for children to become confident citizens in the future.

Diversity


Our pupils will learn about their own identity and locality whilst becoming global citizens by exposing them to communities, cultures and ways of thinking which may different to their own. Thus, allowing our pupils to be empathetic to the experience of others.

Last academic year, we made great strides in working together with you all as parents and carers at Halling Primary School to make positive changes for everyone.

'Your Voice Matters' to us and we can only continue to make these changes if we know about them so thank you for your comments, suggestions and possible solutions when you feel we haven't quite got things right! Thank you also for your positivity when we do get things right - it means a lot!

## It's good to talk



During the school day, children have many opportunities to talk to adults if and when they need to. When talking may not be possible, we have two in-class initiatives that are followed across the school: 'Bubble Time' and 'Think Boxes'. For Bubble Time, your child can move their peg onto the 'talk bubble' to indicate that they would like to speak with an adult regarding an incident or problem. Similarly, the Think Box is for children to share their thoughts or ask a question by writing it down and posting it into the box. All children should be aware that any adult that is seen with a rainbow lanyard is a safe and approachable adult, equipped to deal with any concerns they have.
