




In Term 3, Open Class is on Thursday 2nd February from 3:20pm until 4:00pm.

The complaints continue to be in respect of parents and carers parking inconsiderately on the kerb, grass verges and/or blocking driveways. This forces pedestrians to walk on the road which is extremely unsafe.

It's good to talk

During the school day, children have many opportunities to talk to adults if and when they need to. When talking may not be possible, we have two in-class initiatives that are followed across the school: 'Bubble Time' and 'Think Boxes'. For Bubble Time, your child can move their peg onto the 'talk bubble' to indicate that they would like to speak with an adult regarding an incident or problem. Similarly, the Think Box is for children to share their thoughts or ask a question by writing it down and posting it into the box. All children should be aware that any adult that is seen with a rainbow lanyard is a safe and approachable adult, equipped to deal with any concerns they have.


Our improvement priorities in Halling's 180 Day Plan for Terms 1-3 are as follows:

5. Strengthening the Curriculum across the School, including Wider Opportunities

Number 2 is all about 'Kagan Structures'. Your child may have come home and talked about: Rally Robin, Round Robin and Think Pair Share! These are just some of the strategies we are now using in our lessons to enable the children to have a more active role in collaboration with their class mates. Research shows that this approach to teaching and learning helps with long term memory retention and, of course, it goes hand in hand with our Chris Quigley curriculum which is also designed around long term memory retention. You could ask your child if they have used the Kagan Mat below - can they explain it to you?



Aspiration	Our pupils will learn the importance of aiming high. It will allow them to recognise and explore all opportunities to them both now and in the future. In order to achieve their goals, our children will need to become resilient, reflective and persevering individuals in all that they do.
Curiosity	Our curriculum will inspire pupils to have the confidence to explore, investigate and immerse themselves in their creativity and learning.
Independence	At Halling, we want our pupils to be lifelong learners; independence is key for them to be able to reach this end goal. We aim to promote independence and perseverance for children to become confident citizens in the future.
Diversity	Our pupils will learn about their own identity and locality whilst becoming global citizens by exposing them to communities, cultures and ways of thinking which may different to their own. Thus, allowing our pupils to be empathetic to the experience of others.





# NSPCC Number Dev

We are delighted to be supporting the NSPCC by taking part in Number Day on **Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2023.** Number Day is a great way to make maths fun and bring about a positive, 'can-do' attitude towards it.

Halling will be taking part in **Dress up for Digits** and have some fun maths activities planned for the day. We are asking the children to wear an item of clothing with a number on it, for example, a football shirt, cap, netball shirt or even a onesie! They could get even more creative by dressing in a maths or numbers theme. To help raise money for the NSPCC, we are asking for voluntary donations of **£1**. We'd love everyone in the school (including all staff) to take part in this very special event. Miss Martin will be awarding prizes for the best dressed child in each class. By raising money, we can help to fund NSPCC's vital services such as Childline, the helpline that's

always there for children and young people whatever their problem or concern.

### Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS)

As you are aware, February 3<sup>rd</sup> is NSPCC Number Day! As part of our commitment to make maths exciting and high profile at Halling, we've decided to take part in a friendly competition involving schools in the United Kingdom. It's a 1-day competition which starts on Friday 3rd February 2023 at 07:30 GMT and ends at 19:30 GMT. It's all done online via: play.ttrockstars.com

Children can play in any game mode with every correct answer to a multiplication or division question, earning themselves, their class and the school a point. The Times Tables Rock Stars platform will calculate the class average (the number of correct answers per pupil in the class who play during the competition hours, subject to a 60-minute limit). Winning classes in the school and in the competition as a whole will be the ones with the highest average.

To support player wellbeing, there is a time limit of 60-minutes per player. In other words, each player can earn competition points for up to 60-minutes between 07:30 GMT and 19:30 GMT on Friday 3rd February. Once the player goes beyond 60-minutes of play on that day, they will still earn coins but will no longer earn points towards the competition.

In the spirit of the competition, please don't play on their behalf but by all means, encourage and support them to the extent that it doesn't cause high-stress levels or impact on family plans. Thank you for supporting Halling.
