


### **Attendance and Punctuality**

We are very excited to share with you that each year group is being introduced to a 'resilience' programme in class called the **'Reflective Toolkit'**.

This aims to support children with emotional regulation, resilience and problem solving.

All staff have had training on the programme, led by our Pastoral Lead, Mrs Tyler, and have received their own goody basket and kit for their year group. This was kindly funded by one of our families here at Halling.

The reflective toolkit is multi-purpose - not only will it help children with emotional regulation and resilience but it can also act as a restorative tool to help children to resolve, for example, conflict with others. Over the past year, Mrs Tyler has already used this successfully in classes with individual children and she has also been able to support families to implement the toolkit at home, for example, to help manage their child's anxiety or behaviour at home.

For Bubble Time, your child can move their peg onto the 'talk bubble' to indicate that they would like to speak with an adult regarding an incident or problem. Similarly, the Think Box is for children to share their thoughts or ask a question by writing it down and posting it into the box. All children should be aware that any adult that is seen with a rainbow lanyard is a safe and approachable adult, equipped to deal with any concerns they have.

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

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# E-scooters – are you breaking the law?

## Can I ride my e-scooter to school or work?

No, it's Illegal...

E-scooters are classed as motor vehicles and are required to be taxed and insured. It's not possible to get insurance for privately owned e-scooters, which means it's illegal to use them.

## Can I ride my e-scooter on the pavement?

No, it's Illegal...

You cannot use e-scooters on public footpaths, cycle lanes or roads.

## What happens if I'm caught using my e-scooter in public spaces?

The scooter may be seized and as a result, destroyed.

If stopped by an officer, you may be asked to complete a breath and drugs test. You also risk a £300 fine and six penalty points on your licence for no insurance.




