Holocaust Memorial Day

This year, Medway Council's event was held at Chatham Memorial Synagogue. In preparation, our four children wrote their own version of Elie Wiesel's, 'Never Shall I Forget'. They titled it, 'Our Hope Is':

We hope everyone is free.

On the night, all four children were fantastic ambassadors for Halling. They showed all of our Core Values and performed well in front of other schools in our Trust, schools from elsewhere in Medway and many distinguished guests including: the CEO of our Trust, the Lady Mayor of Medway, The Medway Youth Council, Leader of Medway Council and the District Commander of Medway Police. In addition to the poem, our children had the opportunity to create some art work based on this year's theme of: The Fragility of Freedom. We looked at different work that had been created by survivors of concentration camps during WW2 and other wars around the world since then.

What have we been up to?


On Wednesday 24th January, parents and carers joined Mrs Nott and Mrs Reid for a workshop where they were introduced to all things '**Kagan'** and how it is used at Halling. Kagan is a cooperative learning approach for the classroom and is used in lessons as well as in other areas of the school, such as assemblies and on the playground. All adults have been trained in the approach, with Mrs Nott and Mrs Reid taking the lead in driving forward it's implementation at Halling. They are our, 'Kagan Ambassadors'.

Within lessons, there are a number of core Kagan Structures that are used and that all children are familiar with. Staff have a large bank of alternative structures that can be used.

'Praise' forms a large part of Kagan: children are encouraged to share theirs, and others, successes. With this in mind, each week staff vote on what they want as the 'Cheer of the Week'. This is shared with the children at the start of the following week and is used in classes and for assemblies. Our cheer of the week is also shared on our social media channel @HallingSch on Twitter (X).



School Bus Project

We have some exciting news coming to Halling Primary School...

Ms Jackson and her amazing team are leading a project that will bring an extra learning space that all children and staff will be able to use throughout the school day, in the form of a double decker bus! The bus will be used for children's interventions, play and lunch time activities and so much more...

Ms Jackson has been working hard 'behind the scenes' on this project for a few months now and we are intending to purchase a double decker bus that will be located on Halling's playground. The bus will be separated into zones, both upstairs and downstairs, to cover a variety of learning areas.

The bus will come with the engine, gearbox and seats removed and will be securely put in place to ensure that it is safe for the children to use. The bus may come in a different colour to the photo below and, in time, we would like to decorate it and allow the children to put their own stamp on it.

The recent £2,500 donation and a recent additional anonymous donation of £150 will both be used to give us a head start to our end goal...to purchase the bus and get it towed to Halling Primary School! This alone will cost in the region of £3,000.

Then, we will continue to raise additional funds to support in getting Halling's bus equipped with flooring, electrics, storage units and much more to make it an exciting and inviting place for the children to learn and have fun!

With this is mind, on **Friday 1st March**, we will be holding a **non-uniform day** in return for a **£1 donation** towards this exciting project.

Computing Update

In Term 3, Year 4 looked at using code to create repeating patterns with Mr French. Think digital Spirograph if you are old enough to remember! This was a simple lesson but a fun, entertaining one.

Starting with a simple code with just two movements repeating, the children played with the values to see what happened. They then added more movements and turns and changed the values to see what patterns could be made.


Then it was time to go wild and explore what they could do! They added blocks to change the colour as it created the patterns and then lifted the pen and moved it across before drawing again. The main rule in the Computing Suite when coding is, 'You break it, you fix it!' Sure enough, most of the children did manage to figure out where they had gone wrong when experimenting.


Year 6 left their superhero identities behind and moved on to a bit of coding and looking at how variables work in coding. They started with how a variable is like a jar that they could put numbers or text into. The example code used was a rocket game where the children control the up and down movements of the rocket with the mouse. A rock and planet then move across the screen from right to left and you must move the rocket ship to avoid them. If one of them touches the rocket ship, then the game ends!


The challenge set to all of the children was to change the code so that the rock and planet speeds were not the same and so did not travel across the screen together. There were two ways to achieve this by changing just one value. Most of the children did manage to work this out. Some were given the harder challenge of changing the code to turn the game around in completely the opposite direction.

One of them came really close to completing this before the lesson time ran out. Well done everyone!



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


Attendance and Punctuality

Unfortunately, we continue to receive complaints from residents in the local community who live in the roads closest to our school.

We also regularly receive complaints from parents and carers who continue to be highly concerned about the safety of Halling's children.

The school run is such a busy time and the roads closest to school always become heavily congested.

The complaints have been in respect of parents and carers parking inconsiderately on the kerb, grass verges and/or blocking driveways (see examples below). This has, in turn, forced pedestrians to walk on the road and there have already been a few near misses.

The last thing we want is for anyone to get hurt!

Car idling has also been a recent concern - please switch off you engines whist waiting in your cars.

It's good to talk



During the school day, children have many opportunities to talk to adults if and when they need to. When talking may not be possible, we have two in-class initiatives that are followed across the school: 'Bubble Time' and 'Think Boxes'. For Bubble Time, your child can move their peg onto the 'talk bubble' to indicate that they would like to speak with an adult regarding an incident or problem. Similarly, the Think Box is for children to share their thoughts or ask a question by writing it down and posting it into the box. All children should be aware that any adult that is seen with a rainbow lanyard is a safe and approachable adult, equipped to deal with any concerns they have.
