
# Holocaust Memorial Event

# Kagan Update

Kagan continues to be used across the school, especially in lessons and assemblies. All new staff who have joined Halling since September have also taken part in a one-day workshop that is offered by AAT.

Structures are now well embedded into all subjects allowing the children to maximise their learning opportunities. Why not ask your child/ren about Rally Robin, Rally Coach, Round Robin, Think, Pair, Share or Stand Up, Hand Up, Pair Up. You may want to ask them about our 'Cheer of the Week' as well; this gets shared with children in assembly on Monday and is always very well received. We share it on our social media account (X - @hallingsch) so our wider community can celebrate with us in the right way each week as well!

A focus this year is our use of team and class builders as a way of strengthening relationships between children (and staff!). Tuesday morning assembly time is protected Kagan time across all year groups and we are also looking to extend this further as the academic year progresses. Some examples of the activities that have taken place are 'The Human Knot' in Year 4 and 'Guess the Voice' in Year 3.

# School Bus Project

I would like to start with a **BIG** thank you to everyone who has continued to come forward with ideas or materials and offered their services to help support Halling's ongoing bus project!

I just wanted to give you a little update. Mrs Medhurst is currently working on the seats, we have new foam and material and she has kindly offered to cover the seats for us in all areas on the bus. This has already been started.

During half term, the rest of the flooring was laid as the weather has become warmer to allow the floor to stick.

We have ordered a lock for the doors on the bus to make it even more secure.

We have also ordered new sealant to go around the windows to help stop or prevent any leaks.

The electrics are complete on the bus and a dehumidifier has been fitted which helps with condensation.

The challenge runs from 24<sup>th</sup> March - 4<sup>th</sup> April 2025. It's free to take part and we would love everyone to be involved.

#### What do you need to do?

Encourage your child(ren) to walk, use a wheelchair, scoot or cycle to school on as many days as possible during the event.

#### Including everyone

We want to make sure that everyone can get involved in Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel.

We know it may be more difficult for some pupils to take part than others. If you want to discuss more about your child(ren)'s specific needs, please contact Miss Marsh and we will make sure to look into how your child(ren) can take part.

#### Why are we taking part?

Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel is a great way to build physical activity in children's daily routine which is important for their physical health and mental wellbeing.

Active school runs also help to reduce congestion and air pollution outside the school gate. <u>A 2021 YouGov study</u> showed nearly half of UK children worry about air pollution near their school and that children thought active travel was the best away to bring down these pollution levels.

Plus, there are some great prizes to be won every day if we get enough children taking part!

# WOW - The Walk to School Challenge

Halling Primary School has chosen to be part of an exciting behaviour-change initiative to encourage more children and their families to walk to school. **WOW – the walk to school challenge** is delivered by Living Streets, the UK charity for everyday walking, to help as many children as possible to experience the benefits of walking to school.

The pupil-led challenge will see children self-report how they get to school every day. If they travel sustainably at least once a week for a month, they get rewarded with a badge. It's that simple!

#### What are the benefits of walking to school?

Walking to school helps children feel happier and healthier. They arrive refreshed, healthy and ready to learn. More families walking means fewer cars on the road, helping to reduce congestion and pollution at the school gates.

#### What if we can't walk to school?

If you live too far away or don't have time to walk the whole way to school, you can Park and Stride to help your child earn their WOW badge. Simply park, hop off public transport or ask your taxi to stop at least ten minutes away from the school and walk the remaining journey.

#### What is a WOW badge?

There is a unique WOW badge to earn every month if you walk, wheel, cycle, scoot or Park and Stride at least once a week. Each badge has been designed by a pupil from across the UK as part of an annual WOW Badge Design Competition.

The badges are made in Cornwall from repurposed plastic material that was otherwise destined for landfill, including fridge trays, plastic plates and yoghurt pot off-cuts. For more information, please

The complaints have been in respect of parents and carers parking inconsiderately on the kerb, grass verges (top of Howlsmere) and on/or blocking driveways. This has, in turn, forced pedestrians to walk on the road with a few near misses.

## We're updating the way we enforce school keep clear measures at Halling Primary School

We are introducing static camera enforcement to better manage the existing school keep clear measures outside Halling Primary School, on Howlsmere Close.

School keep clear markings provide safe, visible areas for students to cross the road and enter the school grounds. The school keep clear is currently enforced using camera cars and foot patrol officers. By updating to a static camera we can better enforce current restrictions and encourage safer and compliant parking, for the benefit of children, their families and road users.

The enforcement of school keep clear measures is designed to create a clear space for ease of access to help protect children on their way to and from school.

To ensure the keep clear zone is highly visible for drivers and pedestrians there will be new signage and clearly marked lines painted on the road.

Cameras will be installed from 25 November 2024. These cameras are only used for the purpose of enforcing this parking restriction.



#### **Attendance and Punctuality**

In order to reduce the number of children arriving late for school in the morning, we thought it would be another good opportunity to remind you of the following points:

- Pupils must arrive in school by <u>08:50</u> on each school day.
- The register for the first session will be taken from 08:45 and will be kept open until 08:50.
- A pupil who arrives late via the office (after the register has closed at 08:50) but before 09:00, will be marked as late, using the L code.
- A pupil who arrives after 09:00 will be marked as late or absent, using the U code (unauthorised).
