in the classroom

In English, we will be studying War Horse by Michael Morpurgo. We will continue to look at different aspects of Year 6 Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPAG) to include in our writing in different genres of writing such as a narrative, biographies and poetry. Try to log onto Spelling Shed to help with learning the Year 5 and 6 spelling words and spelling rules taught in class. In our final term, we will be revisiting previous maths topics which have been taught throughout the year that have been tricky to consolidate. We will also apply knowledge to 'real life' maths including things such as budgeting. Every week, we will be looking at arithmetic to make sure we are able to use the different methods we have learnt over the past

During Term 6, we will continue to learn about World War 2 in history and biomes in geography. In science, we will investigate Fossils. The children will be working on themed projects which support transition to secondary school science. We also have exciting lessons in other curriculum subjects.
