- Boosters will continue this term. Thank you for your continued support in encouraging your child to attend these sessions.

in the classroom

In English, we will be studying the text Light Jar by Lisa Thompson. We will be learning about different styles of writing and applying this to our own writing with elements of SPAG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar). Try to log onto Spelling Shed to help with learning the Year 5 and 6 spelling words as we will try and include them in our writing regularly.

Within maths, we will be focusing on ratio, algebra and decimals. We will continue to revisit previous learning to consolidate what we have learnt. Most Fridays will be spent looking at arithmetic so children use the most efficient method and are able to spot simple mistakes. Try and practise as much as you can at home by using websites such as TTRS.

During term 3, we will learn about the Tudors in history and study South America in geography. In science, we will investigate the circulatory system, diet and sound. Some of these topics would have been learnt at a basic level in Year 5 but allows us to learn at a deeper level in Year 6. We also have exciting lessons in other curriculum subjects.

PE

Outdoor PE will be on **Monday afternoons** and **Indoor PE** will be on a **Wednesday afternoon**. Children need to come into school wearing their PE kits.
