Children are required to wear a tie in Key Stage 2, so all of our current Year 2 children will need to wear a tie from September.

Sublime Science Workshop

We were delighted to welcome Atomic Anna for an exciting two-day Sublime Science workshop enjoyed by every class from EYFS to Year 6. Pupils explored a range of hands-on experiments that brought science to life through investigation, discovery and lots of fun!

In Key Stage 1, children became scientists as they created slime through a cross-polymerisation reaction, learning how temperature, time, agitation and concentration affect the properties of a non-Newtonian liquid.

Key Stage 2 pupils explored forces, pressure, gravity and chemical reactions through a series of thrilling demonstrations, including leaf blower experiments, smoke rings, bouncing smoke bubbles, the "Acetone Cup" experiment and the fascinating "Mr Water Balloon" challenge.

The workshops encouraged curiosity and helped pupils understand scientific concepts such as energy transfer, density, surface tension and air pressure in an engaging and memorable way.

The excitement, enthusiasm and wonder shown by all the children made the workshops a huge success. We are also incredibly grateful to our amazing PTA, whose generous funding made these fantastic workshops possible.

Roots to Food Workshop

In Term 5, Years 1 and 2 had the opportunity to take part in a Roots to Food cooking workshop with Chef Darren. The children cooked Cantonese sweet and sour chicken/tofu vegetables with pineapple rice. They were all experts at using the claw and bridge method for cutting and chopping the vegetables and learned all about the nutritional value of all the ingredients they were using. The best bit of course was the tasting at the end. Delicious!

Coffee Club

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are delighted to re-share some exciting news from our pupils! A group of children at our school have come together to form an environmentally friendly **Action Team**, which they have proudly branded **Coffee Club**.

As part of their work to care for our environment, the Coffee Club are launching a recycling project focused on **used coffee pods**. The children plan to recycle the pods themselves and use any leftover coffee grounds to create compost, helping to reduce waste and promote sustainability.

To support this project, the children are kindly asking for help from our school community. If you use coffee pods at home, they would be very grateful if **used pods** could be brought into school and handed to a **class teacher or a member of the office team**, so the pods can continue on their recycling journey.

We are aware that **free coffee pod recycling bags** are available from many supermarkets, including **Morrisons**, who provide Nespresso recycling bags. These may be helpful for collecting pods at home before bringing them into school.

Please note that, in line with our **nut and seed free policy**, it is essential that **no coffee pods containing nuts, or with even traces of nuts, are brought into school**. Thank you very much for your continued care and support with this important requirement.

We are incredibly proud of the children for taking the lead on this project and thank you in advance for supporting their efforts. If you have any questions, please feel free to get in touch with the school.

Aletheia runs a successful school-centred teacher training programme in partnership with **Teach First**, giving you the chance to train in local primary and secondary schools.

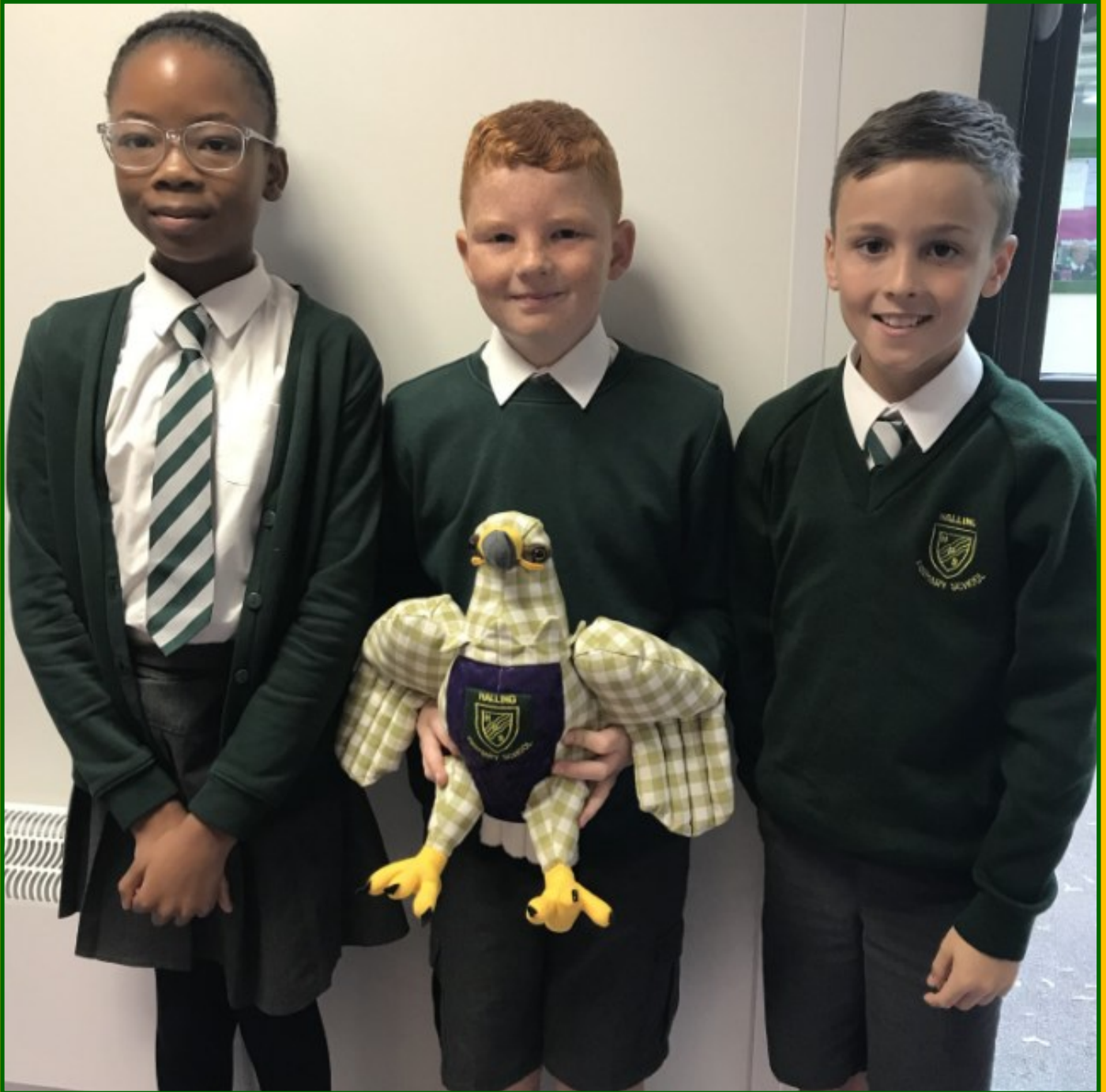
We will support you through the application, interview, and training process, tailoring the programme to help you start your teaching career confidently.
